Code Corner

True or false? If a 100 ampere, 120/240 Volt, single-phase dwelling unit service is installed to the minimum requirements of the NEC, and a metal underground water pipe electrode and a concrete encased electrode are present, then a minimum of a #4 AWG grounding electrode is required to be installed to the concrete encased electrode and a minimum of two ground rods are required to be installed to supplement the underground metal water pipe electrode.

Optional Books \$ CE Classes

Stipend check disbursements have changed this school year, and so have optional book and class reimbursements. Apprentices are eligible for up to \$150 worth of free optional books and Continuing Ed (CE) classes. To take advantage of this, you can register for CE classes on our website through your JATC web account, and upon successful completion of the course, would receive a full refund (up to \$150 total) for the original registration fee. A list of optional books can be found in the lobby near the book window, and can be purchased at the front desk. We do not stock all optional items, but they would typically arrive in 1-2 weeks. Books do not need to be paid for up front, but will be tracked. If you go over the \$150 maximum amount for books and/or classes, you would be responsible for the balance. If you do not successfully complete the school year, you would then be invoiced for any optional books and class refunds at that time. Please contact us with any questions or concerns.

The Importance of Timecards

Did you know that the MN Dept. of Labor requires all indentured apprenticeship programs to track apprentice hours via timecards? In addition to keeping compliant with the state, we also use your timecards to compare your hours to the contractor's hours to ensure your benefits are being paid properly. We do not enjoy enforcing disciplinary actions on those who turn their timecards in late, but must have policies in place so we can stay up to date on our state requirements bookkeeping.
