Code Corner

A level 2 EVSE is to be installed in a dwelling unit garage and has a current rating of 32 amperes. What is the minimum size OCPD and NM-B cable required to supply the EVSE?

Answer will appear in next month's newsletter.

Last month's answer:

The answer is no. Section 517.13(A) specifically requires that all branch circuits serving patient care spaces to be provided with an effective ground-fault current path by installation of a metal raceway or cable having a metal armor or sheath assembly. The raceway or cable jacket needs to qualify as an equipment grounding conductor in accordance with 250.118. In addition to the raceway or cable qualifying as an acceptable equipment grounding conductor, a continuous identified green insulated copper conductor is required by 517.13(B) to be installed.
